PREFACE

The Census-Catalogue is a project of the Musicological Archives for Renaissance Manuscript Studies of the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, a research center established in 1966 for the collection and dissemination of information about manuscripts of Renaissance polyphony. The Archives are directed by Herbert Kellman (University of Illinois) and Charles Hamm (Dartmouth College; formerly of the University of Illinois). Associate members are Margaret Bent (Princeton University), David Crawford (University of Michigan), Andrew Hughes (University of Toronto), Lewis Lockwood (Harvard University), Leeman Perkins (Columbia University), Joshua Rifkin (Cambridge, Massachusetts), Robert J. Snow (University of Texas at Austin), and Tom Ward (University of Illinois). The Archivist is Jerry Call (University of Illinois).

Over 20 years have passed since Charles Hamm, Andrew Hughes, David Crawford, and the present writer gathered in an office in Hill Annex at the University of Illinois to found the Archives and set in motion a project—one Charles Hamm had been nurturing for some time—that was to become the Census-Catalogue. Now, with the completion of Volumes IV and V, the Census-Catalogue has reached its first ending. Its history has been one of growth and increasing momentum. For the first volume, notwithstanding the dedication and hard work of a succession of research assistants, ten years were required to reach final draft, and another two to revise further, index, and typeset the volume, before it could make its appearance in 1979. By that time, however, the project had received the first of three major grants from the National Endowment for the Humanities, and
